Kanji 100 Workshop

Don't think learning kanji is hard. Join us for a 90 minute introductory workshop and master 100 Kanji!

KANJI 100 (Beginning Kanji) is an introduction to written Japanese for the beginning student. The class explains the history of kanji and their relationship with hiragana and katakana. Many of the radicals which make up the kanji are introduced and the student will then learn to recognize 100 basic kanji using mnemonic devices. The class is designed to unlock the "mystery of kanji" and provide the student with tools for further study of the Japanese written language. No previous Japanese experience is necessary, but the student should be prepared to have fun and get "hooked on kanji."
